Ben Dearnley Exhibition 'Avenue of Champions'

Saturday 23 June -Sunday 16 September (9.00am - 5.00pm Mon - Sat, 12.00 - 4.00pm Sun)

Ben Dearnley brings his 'Avenue of Champions' to Salisbury Cathedral for three months to coincide with the 2012 London Olympics and Paralympics. His sculptures focus on the 'power zones' of up to 15 of some of the UK's past and current Olympic and Paralympic champions and are sculpted of bronze and marble. They will be located in the cathedral's cloisters where visitors will be able to walk through the 'Avenue' viewing each sculpted athlete as they go.

Arrives late Wednesday 11 July (event at Hudson's Field, Salisbury) and visits Salisbury Cathedral early morning on Thurs 12 July 2012.
